The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Alaska District (Corps) is applying for a State Water Quality Certificate for the following project:

Construct Navigation Improvements in the Petersburg South Harbor and Dispose of Dredged Material in Frederick Sound

The Alaska District proposes to deepen the South Harbor in Petersburg, Alaska in order to enable safe navigation. The existing condition poses a navigational hazard for the deeper drafting vessels that call on the South Harbor. The dredging project is divided into four dredging units according to depth; ranging from minus 9 feet mean lower low water (MLLW) to minus 19.25 feet MLLW. Project depth would be achieved through the use of an excavator mounted on a barge in order to dislodge the consolidated clay underlying the granular sediment. The total volume of material that will be excavated from the South Harbor is approximately 83,000 CY. The sediment would be placed in the Frederick Sound Disposal Area in accordance with the site selection study and application of Ocean Dumping Criteria under Section 103 of the Marine Protection, Research and Sanctuaries Act (MPRSA).

The Corps provided public notice of the Feasibility Report and integrated Environmental Assessment (EA) on October 4th, 2018.
