**PROPOSED SU-KNIK MITIGATION BANK MODIFICATION  
SPECIAL PUBLIC NOTICE  
MODIFICATION TO MITIGATION BANKING INSTRUMENT  
EXPANSION OF SERVICE AREA  
AND  
CONSOLIDATION OF EXISTING SITE-SPECIFIC BANK SERVICE AREAS**

Interested parties are hereby notified that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Alaska District (Corps) is seeking comments on a proposal from the Su-Knik Wetland Mitigation Bank (Su-Knik) to modify the bank’s service area currently servicing a portion of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough (MSB). Su-Knik is requesting to expand their service to the extent of the political boundary of the MSB. They are also proposing to consolidate the site-specific bank service areas; this would mean that any parcels certified under the Umbrella mitigation banking instrument (MBI) of Su-Knik would be able to provide compensatory mitigation for impacts in the political boundary of the MSB. A memorandum describing the proposed modification of the MBI has been received from the program sponsor, the Su-Knik and is enclosed with this notice.

The term "mitigation bank" refers to a site or suite of sites, where resources (e.g., wetlands, streams, riparian areas) are restored, established, enhanced, and/or preserved for the purpose of providing compensatory mitigation for impacts authorized by Department of the Army (DA) permits. In general, a mitigation bank sells compensatory mitigation credits to permittees whose obligation to provide compensatory mitigation is then transferred to the mitigation bank sponsor. The operation and use of a mitigation bank are governed by a MBI which is the legal document for the establishment, operation, and use of a mitigation bank. The term “service area” refers to the geographic area in which impacts can be mitigated at a specific mitigation bank, as designated in its MBI.

The Corps has convened an Interagency Review Team (IRT) comprised of Federal and State agencies. This team worked with Su-Knik to approve Su-Knik’s MBI and will be reviewing this modification request. If this modification is approved, the changes to the service area would be incorporated as amendments to Su-Knik’s MBI.
