GENERAL PERMIT 87-30
FOR MOORING BUOYS ON THE KASILOF RIVER

This General Permit (GP) shall serve as notice to all interested agencies and members of the public for all mooring buoys to be placed on the Kasilof River during the duration of this GP. No additional public notice shall be given. The authority by which the Corps of Engineers (Corps) regulates this activity is given under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors act of 1899.

This GP extends the previously authorized GP (87-3N) for mooring buoys on the Kasilof River for an additional period of five years. All other terms and conditions of the previous authorization remain in full force and effect. This GP may be further extended if review of the program indicates that extension is appropriate.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS: Each buy owner (permittee) shall be required to obtain a letter of authorization (LOA) from the Alaska District Corps of Engineers which will be consistent with the conditions of this GP. These LOA's shall be issued without further public notice. The LOA's previously issued under GP 87-3N remain in effect for the duration of this GP.

- a. The permittee is responsible for placing and maintaining authorized buoys at the assigned location.
- b. Regarding disputes involving the placement of buoys, the permittee agrees that the Corps decision is final. The permittee agrees to take the action directed by the Corps in resolving such disputes including relocation or removal of the buoy.
- c. The permittee agrees not to use any buoy for which the Corps is involved in the resolution of a violation or disputed location and had so notified the permittee. The permittee further agrees that he or she will make arrangements to moor boats elsewhere until the conflict is resolved to the satisfaction of the Corps.

- d. Actions taken by the Corps regarding any of these special conditions or any other terms of this general permit shall not be cause for claim against the United States government.
- e. Buoys shall be located not less than 150 feet apart in the lower river and not less than 100 feet apart in the upper river. The dividing line between the upper and lower river is the upstream side of the old "Waterfall Cannery" facility.
- f. Permittees shall keep all their boats moored within a 75-foot radius of their buoy in the lower river and within a 50-foot radius in the upper river. Operators are responsible for the proper anchor weight and line length necessary to comply.
- g. Boats shall be moored on one side of the river only as shown on the attached map.
- h. Operators shall place their buoy anchors out of the center of the navigation channel.
- i. No vessels shall be moored within 150 feet of the old ADOT dock.
- j. Permits shall not be sold.
- k. All buoys shall be a minimum of 24 inches in diameter and shall be clearly marked with the operators permit waterway number in black 2" high figures. (i.e., All buoys authorized by the designation Kasilof River 1 shall be marked KAS 1).
- l. Buoys shall be white or international orange.
- m. No more than four boats greater than 25 feet in length overall shall be moored to one buoy at one time. No more than six boats total, at any one time, may be moored to a buoy (i.e., four fishing boats and two skiffs).
- n. Buoys mooring only skiffs shall be limited to a maximum of six skiffs. This general permit does not authorize structures other than buoys, which are used to moor boats or skiffs.
- o. Mooring buoys must be removed from the river by December 1 of each year and may not be set prior to March 1 of each year.
- p. Individual authorization shall expire if not used in two consecutive years.
- q. Individuals wishing to be considered for buoy authorization in locations where previous authorizations have expired, been abandoned or revoked should contact this office, in writing. A list will be kept in the order applications are received.
- r. All buoys shall be numbered in ascending order from the river's mouth. Buoy numbers shall be assigned by the Corps.

GENERAL CONDITIONS: Authorizations issued under this GP are also subject to the following conditions:

- a. This GP and all letters of authorization issued pursuant to this GP expire in five years from the effective date of this GP.
- b. You must maintain the activity authorized by this GP in good condition and in conformance with the terms and conditions of the GP. You are not relieved of this requirement if you abandon the permitted activity, although you may make a good faith transfer to a third party in compliance with General Condition "d" below. Should you wish to cease to operate under this GP, you must contact this office.
- c. If you discover any previously unknown historic or archeological remains while accomplishing the activity authorized by this permit, you must immediately notify this office of what you have found. We will initiate the Federal and State coordination required to determine if the remains warrant a recovery effort or if the site is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.
- d. If you wish to transfer this authorization you must contact this office. At initial contact, please provide the full name, address, and phone number of the transferee.
- e. If a conditioned water quality certification has been issued as part of your authorization, you must comply with the conditions specified in the certification as special conditions to this permit. If applicable, a copy of the certification is attached for your convenience if it contains such conditions.
- f. You must allow representatives from this office to inspect the authorized activity at any time deemed necessary to ensure that it is being or has been accomplished in accordance with the terms and conditions of your permit.

FURTHER INFORMATION:

- a. Congressional Authorities: You have been authorized to undertake the activity described above pursuant to:
 - Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (33 U.S.C. 304)
- b. Limits of this authorization:
 - (1) This permit does not obviate the need to obtain other Federal, State, or local authorizations required by law.
 - (2) This permit does not grant any property rights or exclusive privileges.
 - (3) This permit does not authorize any injury to the property rights of others.

- (4) This permit does not authorize interference with any existing or proposed Federal projects.
- c. Limits of Federal Liability: In issuing this permit, the Federal Government does not assume any liability of the following:
- (1) Damages to the permitted project it uses thereof as a result of other permitted or unpermitted activities or from natural causes.
 - (2) Damages to the permitted project or uses thereof as a result of current or future activities undertaken by or on behalf of the United States in the public interest.
 - (3) Damages to persons, property, or to other permitted or unpermitted activities or structures caused by the activity authorized by this permit.
 - (4) Design or construction deficiencies associated with the permitted work.
 - (5) Damage claims associated with any future modification, suspension, or revocation of this permit.
- d. Reliance of Applicant's Data: The determination of this office that issuance of this permit is not contrary to the public interest was made in reliance on the information provided by each applicant.
- e. Reevaluation of Permit Decision: This office may reevaluate its decision on this permit at any time that the circumstances warrant. Circumstances that could require a reevaluation include, but are not limited to, the following:
- (1) An individual permittee fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this permit.
 - (2) The information provided by individual permittees in support of a permit application proves to have been false, incomplete, or inaccurate.
 - (3) Significant new information surfaces which this office did not consider in reaching the original public interest decision. Such a reevaluation may result in a determination that it is appropriate to use the suspension, modification, and revocation procedures contained in 33 CFR 325.7 or enforcement procedures such as those contained in 33 CFR 326.4 and 326.5. The referenced enforcement procedures provide for the issuance of an administrative order

requiring the permittees to comply with the terms and conditions of the general permit and for the initiation of legal action where appropriate. An individual permittee will be required to pay for any corrective measures ordered by this office, and if the permittee fails to comply with such directive, this office may in certain situations (such as those specified in 33 CFR 209.170) accomplish the corrective measures by contract or otherwise and bill the permittee for the cost.
