CLARE F. FARLEY
Author Biography

Colonel Clare F. Farley is the District Engineer for the U. S. Army Engineer District, Alaska, since August 1964, the year of the great Alaskan earthquake. A federal reconstruction program valued at \$56 million is assigned to the Alaska District assisting Alaskans to recover from the Quake.

Previously, Colonel Farley was staff officer in the Plans and Policy Division of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, 1963-64; he was on the Department of Army staff in Washington, 1961-62; he attended the War College in Carlisle, Pennsylvania in 1960; he served in Europe 1957-60; he attended the Command and General Staff at Leavenworth, Kansas in 1956; he was structural analysis instructor at West Point 1952-55.

In 1951, he served in Korea; in 1948-50 in Japan; in Ft. Belvoir, 1947. He served in the European theater, 1943-45. He is a graduate of the Military Academy at West Point in 1943 and holds a master's degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Iowa, 1946. He is a registered professional engineer in New York. His hometown is Aurora, Illinois. Colonel Farley is married; he has four children.
