Background

BI-NATIONAL (NORAD)



Alaskan NORAD Region

- Provide continuous warning/assessment of Aerospace Attack
- Maintain Aerospace Control to include Air Sovereignty & Air Defense of ANR's AOR

US JOINT (PACOM)



Alaskan Command

- Integrate military activities within Alaska
- Maximize readiness of theater forces
- Support worldwide contingencies

US JOINT (NORTHCOM)



JTF-Alaska

- Detect, deter, prevent and defeat terrorist threats within the Alaska JOA
- Conduct Civil Support as directed

AIR FORCE (PACAF)



Eleventh Air Force

- Organize, Train, Equip Forces
- Provide forces to unified commanders
- Provide C3 for SAR
