MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Pre-2015 Regulatory Regime Approved Jurisdictional Determination in Light of *Sackett v. EPA*, 143 S. Ct. 1322 (2023),¹ POA-2024-00458, MFR 1 of 1²

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.³ AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.⁴ For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),⁵ the Clean Water Act (CWA) implementing regulations published by the Department of the Army in 1986 and amended in 1993 (references 2.a. and 2.b. respectively), the 2008 *Rapanos-Carabell* guidance (reference 2.c.), and other applicable guidance, relevant case law and longstanding practice, (collectively the pre-2015 regulatory regime), and the *Sackett* decision (reference 2.d.) in evaluating jurisdiction.

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. The features addressed in this AJD were evaluated consistent with the definition of “waters of the United States” found in the pre-2015 regulatory regime and consistent with the Supreme Court’s decision in *Sackett*. This AJD did not rely on the 2023 “Revised Definition of ‘Waters of the United States,’” as

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amended on 8 September 2023 (Amended 2023 Rule) because, as of the date of this decision, the Amended 2023 Rule is not applicable in this state due to litigation.

1. SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS.

- a. The review area is comprised entirely of dry land (i.e., there are no waters such as streams, rivers, wetlands, lakes, ponds, tidal waters, ditches, and the like in the entire review area and there are no areas that have previously been determined to be jurisdictional under the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 in the review area).

There are no wetlands or other waters mapped at the site and a reconnaissance site visit conducted on August 23, 2024, found no evidence of aquatic resources. Based on the best available information, we determined that the review area consists of entirely dry land; there are no aquatic resources within the review area.

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3. REVIEW AREA.

The review area is a 9.101-acre lot located within Section 16, T. 2 S., R. 2 E., Fairbanks Meridian; Latitude 64.73438, Longitude -147.34373, Lot 1 of Alaska State Land Survey (ASLS) No. 2003-50; east of 1150 H & H Lane; in North Pole, Alaska. See attached figure. Previous JDs (POA-2002-00849 & POA-1985-00835) in the vicinity of the review area concluded that nearby parcels are entirely uplands. The nearby parcels are nearly identical to the review area in plant composition, mapped soil units, and lack of mapped wetlands or other waters. The National Hydrography Dataset (NHD) shows no surface water features within the review area. Review of recent aerial imagery showed no signs of surface water, including flow patterns and no indications of wetlands.

The northeast corner and southern half of the property is forested with mature trees that appear to include Alaska paper birch (*Betula neoalaskana*) and white spruce (*Picea glauca*), species that are commonly found in uplands. The northwest portion of the review area has been cleared of all vegetation, graded, and developed with two large outbuildings. The review area is bordered by roadways and disturbed areas. Based on the best available information, there are no indications that wetlands or other waters are present within the review area.

4. NEAREST TRADITIONAL NAVIGABLE WATER (TNW), INTERSTATE WATER, OR THE TERRITORIAL SEAS TO WHICH THE AQUATIC RESOURCE IS CONNECTED.

The nearest TNW is the Tanana River, approximately 0.40-miles from the review area. There are no aquatic resources in the review area that would connect with this TNW.

 Review Area

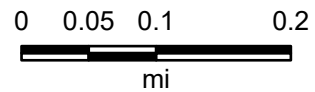
